

Discipline and Manifestation Determination





Course Overview

The purpose of the module is to provide an overview of why Manifestation Determinations Reviews are required when a student receiving special education has been disciplined because of a violation of the code of student conduct and issued removals resulting in a "change in placement." The definitions, examples and other essential information necessary to implement the MDR process effectively will be highlighted to ensure compliance with IDEA requirements.

In this course, the participant will develop an understanding of the discipline of students receiving special education services and manifestation determinations as well as the implications of the law. The participant will also demonstrate the process for manifestation determination through case study analysis and learn the steps in the process for making a Manifestation Determination Review decision and its impact on compliance.
